## **Activity 1: Pre-reading table**

## **Activity 2: Mind-map**

#### Objective: Creating individual visions of a futuristic society

In his futuristic vision, he includes ideas on Great Britain's relationship with other countries as well as for the life quality of individual citizens. Technological innovations and changes in family relationships play a major role in Orwell's work.
